Aim of the European Commission (EC-DG ENTR):

- **To call for a large demonstration project** (Phase II, funding > 20 M€) in EU security R&D on aftermath crisis management in mid 2012
 - **Response to & recovery from large-scale disasters (man-made or natural) inside & outside Europe**

Tasks of ACRIMAS (Phase I):

- **To help to prepare for the call (and the demo project)** by proposing relevant topics to be executed in Phase II, sequenced in a roadmap
